<p>Level 1 \$8.10</p>	<p>Entry-level positions requiring basic skills; performs routine tasks, operates simple equipment and exercises very little independent decision making responsibilities; skills may be attained through on the job training; no previous work experience or course work required.</p>
<p>Level 2 \$8.75</p>	<p>Requires basic skills acquired through some previous work experience, training and/or completion of related coursework; responsibilities may require the application of basic organizational and/or more technical knowledge; operates and is accountable for more complex equipment; exercises some independent decision-making.</p>
<p>Level 3 \$9.25</p>	<p>Considerable work experience and/or completion of related coursework; moderately developed skills; responsibilities may include data analysis, independent supervision or coordination of program or projects involving complex equipment.</p>
<p>Level 4 \$9.75</p>	<p>Considerable to extensive work experience and/or completion of related coursework required; moderately to highly developed skills; responsibilities may include data analysis, independent supervision or coordination of program or projects involving complex equipment; may include day to day supervision of other student employees and independent decision making. May require travel to and from off-campus work site.</p>
