English 1110.01H: Honors First-Year English Composition (3 credits, 34123). *Dr. Elizabeth Weiser. Tues and Thurs 8:00 am-9:20 am.* Provides intensive practice in the fundamentals of expository writing, as illustrated in the student's own writing and in the essays of professional writers. *Prereq: Honors standing, and 28 or above on the English section of the ACT or 660 on the verbal section of the SAT; or permission of instructor. Not open to students with credit for 1110.01 (110.01), 1110.02 (110.02), 1110.02H (110.02H), 110.01H, 1110.03 (110.03), or 1167H (167H).* Available for EM credit. **GE writing and communication course: level 1.**

History 2800E: Introduction to the Discipline of History. (3 credits, 15717). *Dr. Michel Mangus. Mon and Weds 12:45pm-2:05pm.* Investigation of methods and analytical approaches historians use to understand the past. *Prereq or concur: English 1110.xx.* Not open to students with credit for 2800 (398) or 2800H (398H). **GE historical studies and social diversity course.**

History 2750H: Natives and Newcomers: Immigration and Migration in U.S. History (3 credits, 34137) *Dr. Lucy Murphy. Tues and Thurs 3:55 pm- 5:15 pm.* General survey of immigration history in the U.S. from precolonial times to the present. Topics include cultural contact, economic relations, citizenship, politics, family and sexuality. *Prereq: Honors standing, or permission of instructor. Prereq or concur: English 1110.xx.* Not open to students with credit for 322, 322H, or WGSSSt 2750H (332H). **GE historical study and diversity, social diversity in the US course.**

Music 2251E: The World of Classical Music (3 credits, 35270). *Dr. Paul Sanders. Mon and Weds. 9:35 am-10:55 am.* In this introduction to classical music, students explore not only the traditional topics—genres, composers, styles, and historical periods—but ways that classical music is used in film. No music background is required. **GE visual and performing arts and diversity/global studies course.**

Psychology 1100H: Introduction to Psychology (3 credits, 34108). *Dr. Chris Robinson. Mon and Weds 12:45 pm-2:05 pm.* A prerequisite to advanced courses; a broad survey of psychological science. Students will further develop critical thinking skills by writing papers and participating in activities. *Prereq: Honors standing, or permission of instructor.* Not open to students with credit for 1100 (100), 1100E (100E), or 100H. **GE social science individuals and groups and diversity, social diversity in the US course.**

Psychology 3331E: Abnormal Psychology (3 credits, 29518). *A. McDonnell. Tues 5:30 pm to 8:15 pm.* Examination of current theories and empirical findings regarding the major forms of psychopathology. *Prereq: Honors standing, and 1100 (100) or 1100H (100H); or permission of instructor.* Not open to students with credit for 2367.02, 3331 (331), 3331H (331H), or 331E. **Psychology major course.**

History of Art 2001H: Western Art I: Ancient and Medieval Worlds (3 credits), Dr. Bob Calhoun. *Mon, Weds, Fri 8:00 am-8:55 am.* Examination of the history of Western Art from the third millennium BCE to the fifteenth century CE. *Prereq: Honors standing, or by permission of department or instructor. Not open to students with credit for 201, 201H, 210, or 210H.* This course is available for EM credit. **GE VPA and historical study and diversity global studies course.**

Comparative Studies 2104H: Literature, Science, and Technology (3 credits), Dr. Cheryl Cash. *Tues and Thurs 3:55-5:15 pm.* Study of relationships among literature, science, and technology; analysis of representations of science and technology in literature and film of diverse cultures and historical periods. *Prereq: Honors standing and English 1110 (110) or equiv. Not open to students with credit for 2104 (204H, 204).* **GE lit and diversity global studies course.**

Geography 2750H: World Regional Geography (3 credits). Hybrid. Dr. Ken Madsen. *Tues and Thurs 11:10 am-12:30 pm.* An examination of the human and physical geographic structure of all world regions, defined primarily at the continental scale. Examines regions in global context. *Prereq: Honors standing, or permission of instructor. Not open to students with credit for 2750 (200) or 200H.* **GE social science human, natural, and economic resources and diversity global studies course.**
